DON'T BE A PHYTOPHTHORA CARRIER

There are simple things you can do to prevent spreading dieback both to bushland areas and to your home garden:

👉 Avoid travelling & walking through the bush when it's wet & muddy

👉 Start clean & stay clean

Stick to designated roads & tracks 👉

👉 Don't pick plant material

Use commercial car wash facilities where possible to avoid taking mud home with you

👉 Clean & disinfect footwear & equipment - disinfecting is easy if you spray with 70% methylated spirits diluted with water

NOT ONLY YOUR CAR AND SHOES! Clean soil from anything that touches the ground including: backpacks, walking sticks, tent pegs and, of course, tyres and off-road bikes
