Many in the Agriculture community want to move forward First Nations to understand the past, recognise and reconcile with people and country and be part of positive change for now and the future.

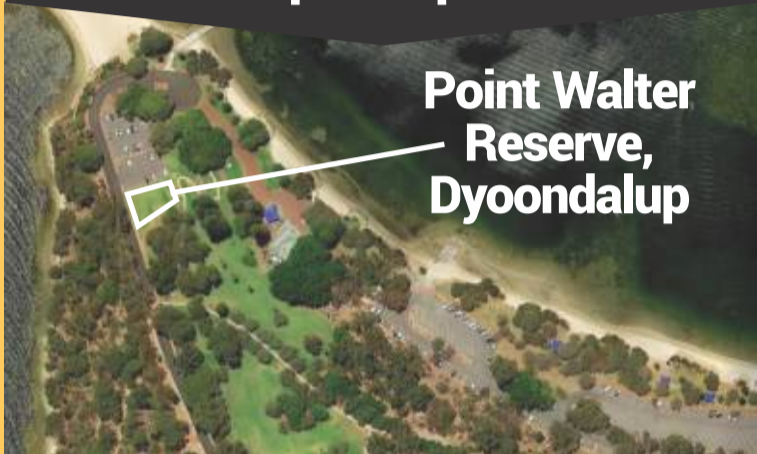
