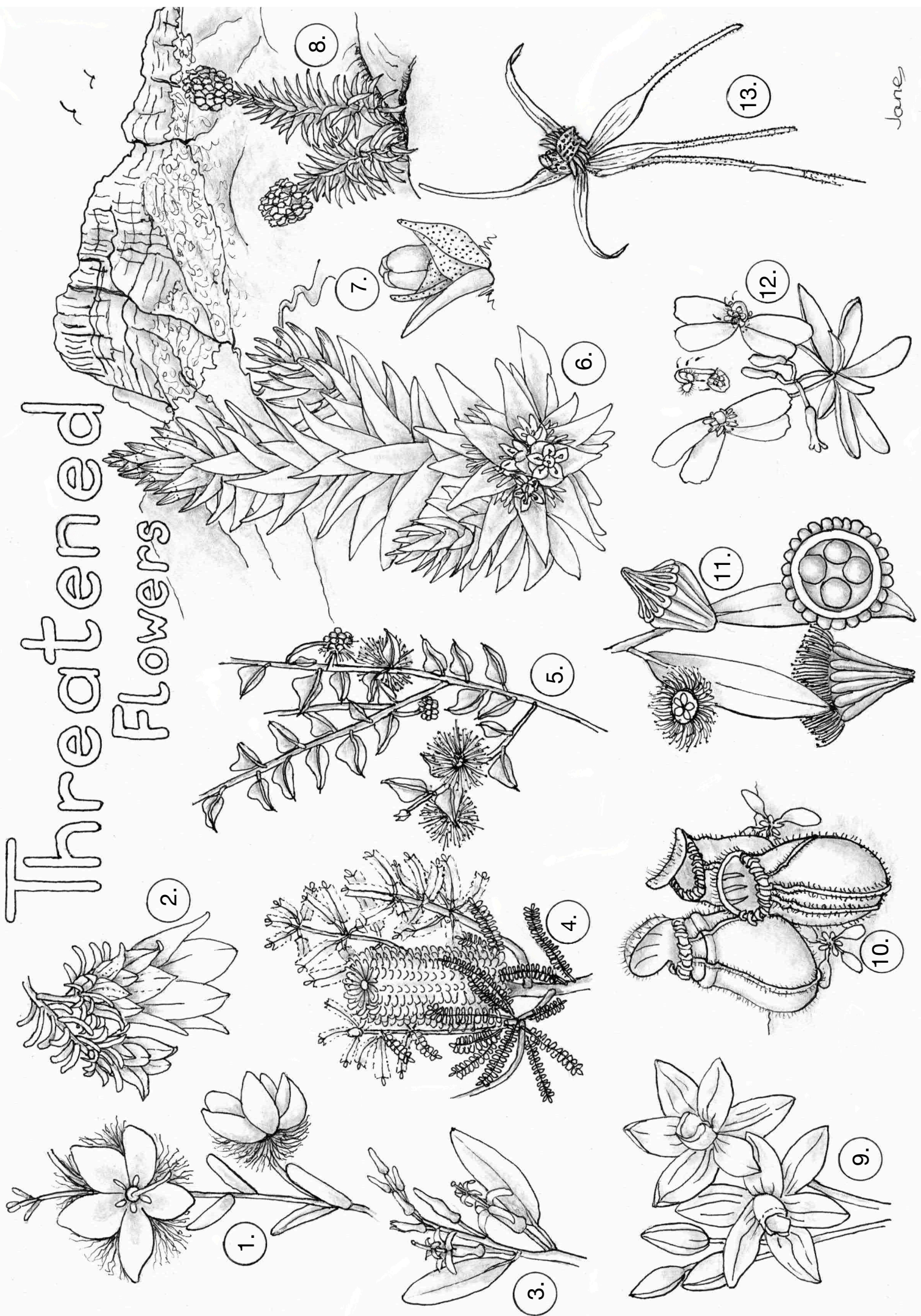

1. Stirling Range featherflower (*Verticordia carinata*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
2. Cranbrook bell (*Darwinia meeboldii*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
3. Small-flowered snottygobble (*Persoonia micranthera*) – Critically Endangered (EPBC Act)
4. Feather-leaved banksia (*Banksia brownii*) – Critically Endangered (EPBC Act)
5. Kundip wattle (*Acacia rhamphophylla*) – Endangered (EPBC Act)
6. Giant andersonia (*Andersonia axilliflora*) – Critically Endangered (EPBC Act)
7. Granite pink (*Tribonanthes purpurea*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
8. Mountain paper-heath (*Sphenotoma drummondii*) – Endangered (EPBC Act)
9. Sandplain sun-orchid (*Thelymitra psammophila*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
10. Albany pitcher plant (*Cephalotus follicularis*) – Vulnerable (IUCN Red List)
11. Crowned mallee (*Eucalyptus coronata*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
12. Yellow mountain triggerplant (*Stylidium galioides*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
13. Pink spider-orchid (*Caladenia harringtoniae*) – Vulnerable (EPBC Act)
