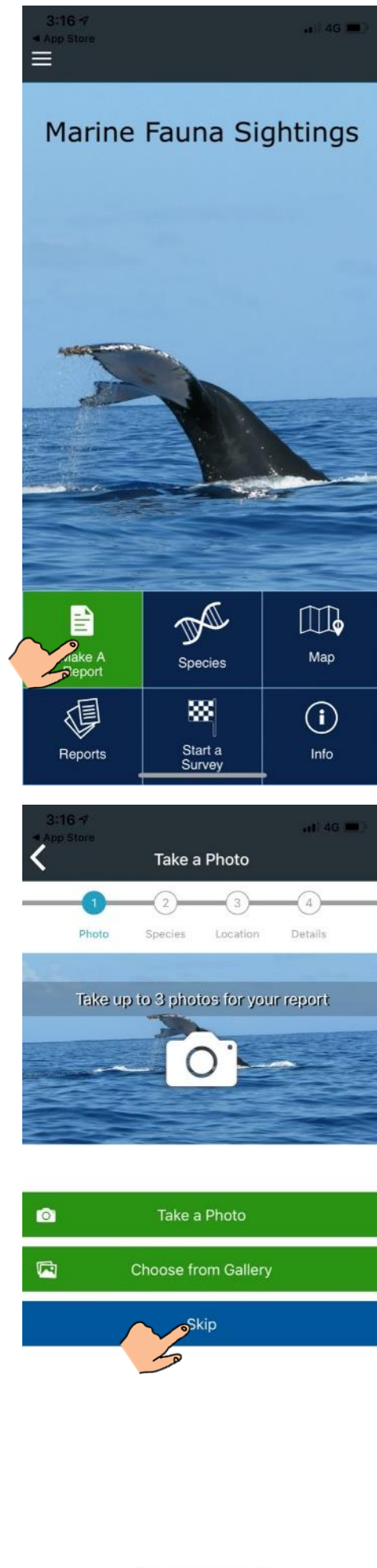


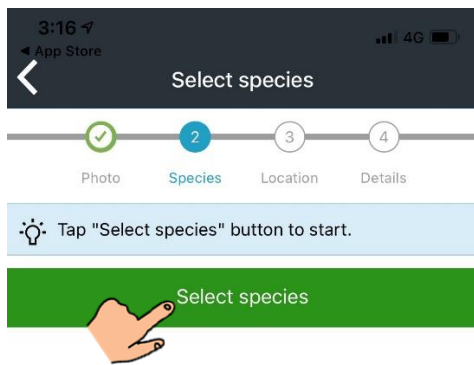


Make a report (steps)

If you see a southern right whale (or other marine animal listed) press the 'Make a Report' button

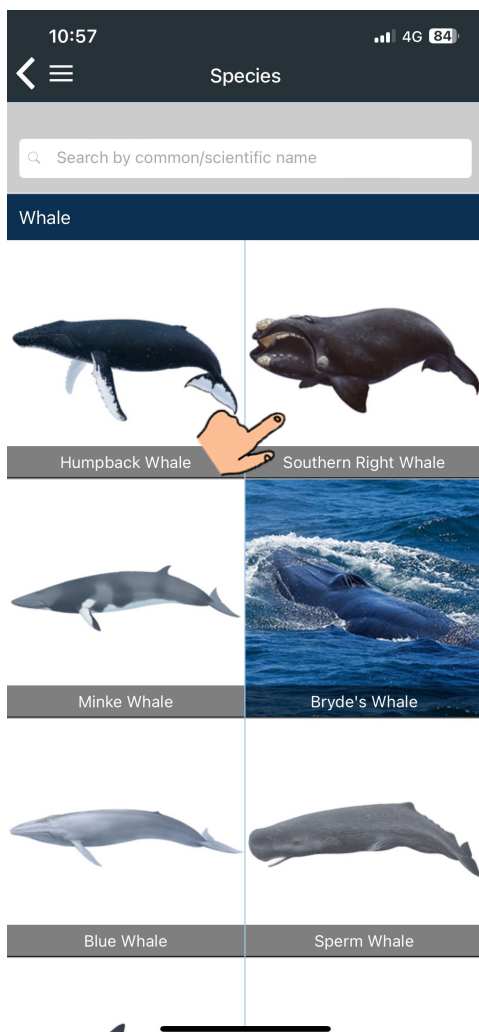
If you have managed to take some photos on your phone, or you have the opportunity to take some photos of the southern right whales you're observing, you can do so now by clicking on 'Take a Photo' or 'Choose from Gallery'.

Otherwise, just click on Skip



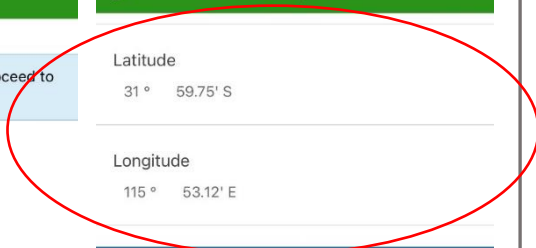
Make a Report (steps continued)

Click on the 'Select species' button to choose the whale species you are reporting on.



Tap on the appropriate species of whale that you are reporting on.

Along the south coast you are likely to see humpback whales and southern right whales, although there are other species too.



If you are reporting while looking at the whales or are still in the area where you saw the whales, simply press 'Use my current location' and the GPS coordinates will be recorded automatically.

Now we enter the information on about what we've observed (e.g., how many adult whales, don't worry about juvenile whales, (treat them as adults) and/or how many calves you observed)

You also get to report on what behaviours you observed the whales displaying. You can only choose one behaviour here from the dropdown menu.

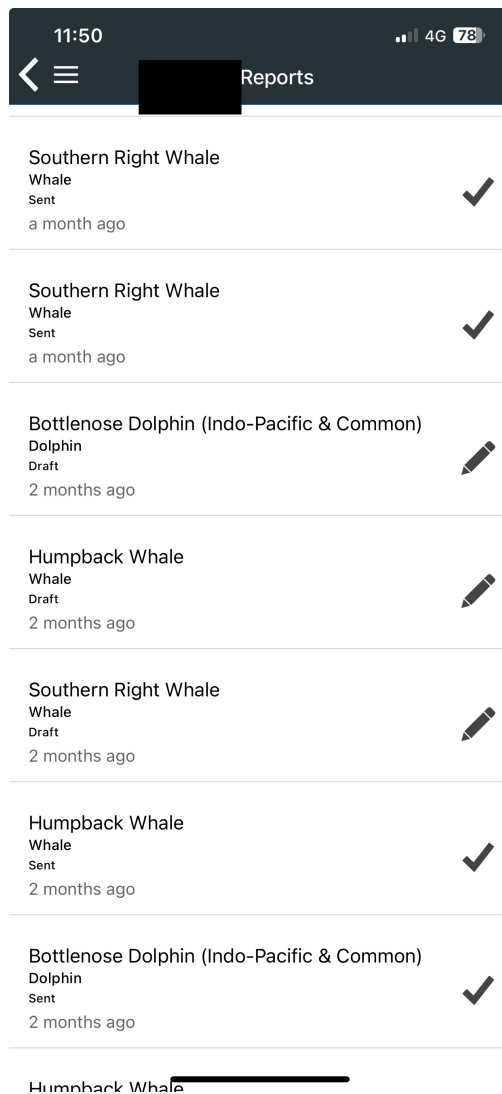
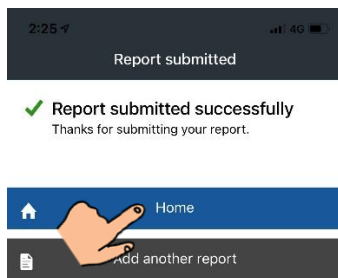

Make a report (steps continued)

Once you've chosen the behaviour you observed, please add any extra information that might help our whale researchers in the Comment section, this includes your initials, weather and wave conditions, which group this report is on and the direction you are looking when you see the whale.

If you have registered as a user on the Marine Fauna Sighting app your details will automatically appear under Your Details.

Once you've entered some comments and checked your Name and Email, you have finished your report and you can click on the 'Submit' button.



Make a report (steps continued)

You've now successfully made your first report!

You can now choose to return to the Home screen or Add another report.

If you return to the Home screen and click on the 'Reports' button you will then be able to see the report you just made and any others that you make moving forward.

You will also have the opportunity to Edit and unfinished reports and submit them.
